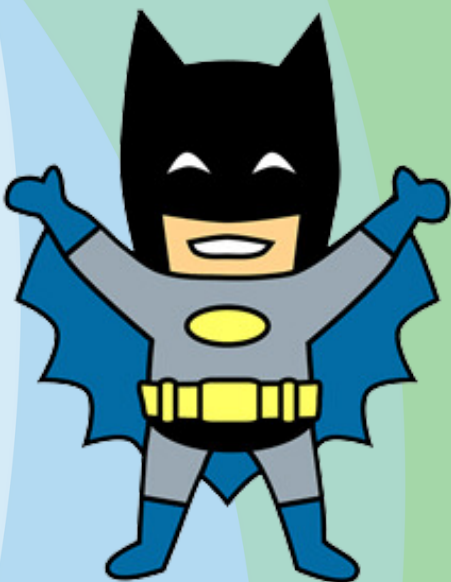

The Tree Troop is thrilled to announce that our school is the recipient of a 2023 Woolworths Junior Landcare Grant of \$1 000.

The name of our project is Creating a Bee & Butterfly Haven. Our aim is to continue the enthusiasm by extending the Bee and Butterfly project (created using 2022 Woolworths Junior Landcare Grant) to encompass the whole school and into the community. The students will be involved in identifying current successful plants and others to attract more local insects. Then they will plan and plant many insect friendly sites.

At this term's first Wednesday meeting, the Tree Troopers made a start by planting the Adelaide Brighton Cement plaque garden bed (at the end of the ATCO) with *Brachyscome multifida* Cut-Leafed Daisies and Lavender plants.

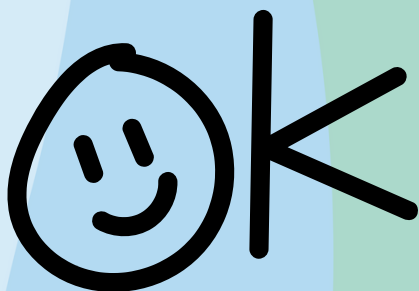

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### NAPLAN (National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy)

We have received the results of this year's NAPLAN testing, which took place in Term 1. The earlier timing of the test has led to changes in the scoring and analysis process. Our staff members are currently sorting and analysing the information to gain valuable insights. This data will help us identify areas for improvement and tailor our future teaching strategies. Please note that NAPLAN is no longer using the terminology of SEA – Standard of Education Achievement and HB – Higher Band, band levels. Instead, we will be using the terms exceeding, strong, developing, and needs additional support. Individual student results will be sent home by the end of week 1.

The survey closes midnight Sunday 27 August.

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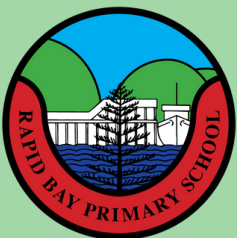
## Inclusion
